

Proposed statement on student actions:

“Our first priority is ensuring the health and safety of all students. Not just students on this campus but throughout our district.

Earlier today we were made aware of a situation on one of our campuses involving a student passing out material (or making statements) that could be viewed as insensitive to members of our school community.

It is the responsibility of our district to conduct a thorough investigation and assess the circumstances of this incident and determine if any steps are needed to ensure the health and safety of our students.

Proposed statement in the event of a collective student action:

California schools are some of the most diverse and welcoming environments and protecting the health, safety, and rights of all California students is priority one for education leaders.

The results of Tuesday’s election have caused concern among students of many backgrounds and perspectives. While we believe and support the students’ first amendment rights and their opportunity to voice concerns, we believe the safest place for students are on our school campuses.

We remain committed to supporting each other’s differences and embrace diversity as a mechanism for uniting as one. We encourage our students, parents, teachers, staff and communities to join together during this period of transition.
